I shared with him the Gospel. He teared up while telling his story of his escape from Cambodia. As a 14 year-old boy, he slept underneath corpse to avoid the Khmer Rouge soldiers. Please continue to pray for Kham Suan. Pray that through our continued communications that he would accept Christ as his personal Saviour.

Last month, I had the privilege of leading a lady to the Lord while doing laundry at a laundromat in Souderton,

Pennsylvania. Praise the Lord!

God has been faithful to give our family (especially the boys) great health. This allows us, as a family, to focus on exactly what the Lord needs us to do every day.
